

Throughout his life Ralph was both knowledgeable and passionate about music, and one of his great pleasures was the series of recitals he arranged at Grove House given by young pianists – including those who are performing in his memory today. At the same time he supported a charity whose aims echo his own interest in helping young musicians.

THE NICHOLAS BOAS CHARITABLE TRUST (Registered Charity No. 1073359) supports young musicians at the start of their careers through grants towards attending masterclasses, travelling to auditions, making initial recordings, commissioning new works, etc., and also organisations such as IMS Prussia Cove, English National Opera, British Youth Opera, etc. who have a particular focus on working with young artists.

The funds for these grants are raised through regular chambermusic concerts in the drawing room of 22 Mansfield Street, at which outstanding young musicians perform, giving their services free of charge. Ralph derived a great deal of pleasure from those concerts.

The Grove House recitals have ended, but their spirit lives on at 22 Mansfield Street, and a donation to the Trust in Ralph's memory (by cheque to the Nicholas Boas Charitable Trust) would help continue his passion for the development and encouragement of young musicians.
